
Madeley – 2011 Census Profile



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1 Population Characteristics

Summary:


- The population of Madeley increased by just 0.9% between 2001 and 2011. The population density of Madeley is 20.0, more than three times higher than the Borough wide population density of 5.7.
- In the decade prior to the 2011 Census, the 0-15 population of the ward decreased slightly from 17.1% to 16.0%, lower than the 20.5% Borough wide.
- Compared to the Borough wide age profile, Madeley is some what older, with lower proportions of all ages under 40 and particularly larger proportions than Borough wide in the 55-64 age groups.

2 Diversity

Summary:

- The BME population of Madeley increased by 30.4% between 2001 and 2011, representing 6.1% of the population compared to 10.6% across the Borough.
- Beside White British, the Asian population remained the largest at 2.4%, an increase from 1.7% in 2001 but still lower than Borough-wide (4.2%).
- Even though the number of Christians decreased by almost 700 people, it still remained the largest religious group in the ward at 63.3%, slightly above the 61.7% seen Borough wide. Hindu and Sikh groups have doubled in the ward since 2001.
- For the first time in a census, people were asked for their main language. Some 2.2% of Madeley residents have a main language other than English, lower than the 4.1% Borough wide.

3 Household and family characteristics

Summary:

- The 2011 Census found 2,429 occupied household spaces in Madeley accommodating 5,268 people, an average household size of 2.17, lower than the 2.47 average household size Borough wide.
- Since 2001, the proportion of one person households has decreased from 35.9% to 34.8% still well above the Borough rate of 25.2%.
- The largest household type in the ward is 'other' (not aged 65 and over) one person households at 18.7%, higher than the 14.5% of households in this category Borough wide.
- Even though the proportion of households that do not have access to car or van decreased from 33.8% to 28.2%, it is still higher than the Borough wide rate 20.6%.
- More than a third (35.7%) of households in Madeley were not deprived in any dimension, lower than the 41.7% of households Borough wide.

4 Housing

Summary:

- The total number of household spaces in Madeley has increased by 66 since 2001 with an increase in the proportion of unoccupied household spaces from 2.3% to 4.1%.
- The predominant accommodation type in the ward is semi-detached houses or bungalows at 34.1%, slightly lower than the Borough rate of 36.7%.
- Some 57.5% of households in Madeley own their home, lower than the 63.7% ownership across the Borough.
- A total of 323 households (13.3%) still believe they rent their home from the Council, a slight increase from 310 households (12.9%) in 2001.
- The proportion of households in Madeley privately renting their home has more than doubled since 2001, from 5.8% to 13.0%.

5 Employment and economy

Summary:

- Between 2001 and 2011 the economically active population in Madeley decreased slightly from 66.4% to 65.9%, below the Borough rate of 69.4%.
- The unemployment rate in the ward increased from 3.4% to 4.4% in the decade preceding the census, slightly below the Borough rate of 4.7%.
- A total of 7.4% of Madeley residents aged 16-74 have never worked, just above the Borough rate of 7.2%.
- The predominant occupation group in the ward is 'professional occupations' (14.0%), similar to the Borough proportion (13.9%).
- More than a third (34.5%) of Household Reference Persons in Madeley are classed as social grade DE - Semi-skilled and unskilled manual workers / On state benefit, unemployed, lowest grade workers, above the Borough wide rate of 30.8%.
- The proportion of residents in employment in the ward who travel to on foot has decreased from 11.3% in 2001 to 7.8% in 2011, just below the Borough rate (8.0%).
- Almost a third (30.0%) of Madeley residents aged 16+ have no qualifications, higher than the 24.6% Borough wide.

6 Health and care

Summary:

- Three quarters (75.2%) of Madeley residents reported good or very good health at the 2011 Census, below the 80.2% Borough wide.
- Some 23.4% of residents in the ward felt their day-to-day activities were limited by a long term health problem or disability, very little change from 23.0% in 2001, and higher than the Borough figure of 18.6%.
- One in nine Madeley residents (11.0%) provide unpaid care similar to the Borough rate of 10.8%.

Notes and definitions

Household deprivation

The 2011 Census categorises households on their deprivation across four dimensions

- Employment Any member of the household aged 16-74 who is not a full-time student is either unemployed or permanently sick
- Education No member of the household aged 16 to pensionable age has at least 5 GCSEs (grade A-C) or equivalent AND no member of the household aged 16-18 is in full-time education
- Health and disability Any member of the household has general health 'not good' in the year before census or has a limiting long term illness
- Housing The household's accommodation is either overcrowded (occupancy indicator is -1 or less) OR is in a shared dwelling OR does not have sole use of bath/shower and toilet OR has no central heating.

Household Reference Persons

HRPs provide an individual person within a household to act as a reference point for producing further derived statistics and for characterising a whole household according to characteristics of the chosen reference person.

- For a person living alone, it follows that this person is the HRP.
- If a household contains only one family, then the HRP is the same as the Family Reference Person (FRP).
- If there is more than one family in a household, the HRP is chosen from among the FRPs using the same criteria used to choose the FRP i.e selected on the basis of their economic activity, in the priority order.
 - Economically active, employed, full-tine, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, full-time student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, student
 - Economically active, unemployed, non-student
 - Economically active, unemployed, student
 - Economically inactive, retired
 - Economically inactive, other
- If some are all FRPs have the same economic activity, the HRP is the eldest of the FRPs, if some or all are the same age, the HRP us the first of the FRPs from the order in which they were listed on the questionnaire.
- If a household is made up entirely of any combination of ungrouped individuals and other related families, the HRP is chosen from among all people in the household, using the same criteria used to choose between FRPs.
- Students at their non term-time address and short-term migrants cannot be HRP.

Dependent children

A dependent child is a person aged 0-15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.
