## Community Pride Fund

The Community Pride Fund is a £1.25 million scheme to help regenerate Telford and Wrekin. Businesses and groups applied for funding for a variety of different projects.

As part of the fund, £8,800 of work will soon be taking place at St Matthews Church.

As residents know, St Matthews
Church is a great space for the
whole Donnington community and
the Community Pride fund will help
make sure it stays this way. Works
that will take place include; repairing
the damaged roof, removing the
kitchen and re-locating it to a stand
alone kitchen with modern facilities.
There will also be upgrades to all
toilet facilities, improvements to
wheelchair accessibility all through
the church and installing hot water.

Donnington Youth Panel, the Youth Innovation Worker and the Community Support Officer have been working together to set up activities for young people in Donnington including art, music and sport activities.

Ward Co-operative Funding will go towards environmental projects including tree works, tidying up overgrown areas of Central Park plus providing two new benches at Barclay Court residential home.

## Donnington Parade

As part of Pride in Your Community, Donnington Parade has had some major improvements.

The Parade offers residents and businesses a variety of shops and restaurants and is an important part of the community.

In July 2014 and residents and shop owners were asked for their opinions for improvement works.

The work started in October on the main car park with the footpath also being resurfaced with block paving. The car park has been relined and the disabled parking bays have been moved closer to the shops. New bollards and hand rails have been installed at the post office.









## Job Box growing services as unemployment figures drop AGAIN!

Over the last year, the council has been committed to reducing youth unemployment in the borough. Through schemes such as Job Box and Young Telford, numbers of those claiming Job Seekers Allowance has fallen by a third.

Telford Job Box isn't just for 16-24 year olds; there are a range of services, education and employment support as well as 'Job Junctions' which offer help and advice to anyone in the borough seeking work and training. The scheme has also just launched 'Young Telford' which helps young people to start a business and provide everything needed to start and grow a self-employed career.

## Junior Street Champions

Junior Street Champions from St Matthews Primary School in Donnington carried out a review of their local streets as part of Pride in Your Community.

Sixty children from Year Three took part in the event, which gave them an opportunity to explore their local environment and develop skills including literacy, numeracy, basic map reading and how to record and catalogue information.

The children logged issues including pot holes, litter and fly-tipping, overhanging shrubs, graffiti and damaged garden fencing. They were given disposable cameras to take pictures of issues they had spotted. One of these was the broken guardrail on the Parade; this has now been replaced as part of Donnington Regeneration.

## Environmental Estate Response Teams

Pride in Your Community teams have been in Donnington fortnightly for five days a week since April 2014 carrying out work such as litter picking and emptying bins to removing litter from woodlands, grass maintenance, painting, hedge maintenance, planting, weeding and more.

There will be many road improvements in Donnington in early 2015, these will include Wellington Road,
Oakengates Road, Turreff Avenue, Wellington Road
(Aldi to A4640), School Road parking areas and St
Georges Road and Wrekin Drive. A dedicated team took to the roads in this Autumn to repair the pot holes in the area. The footpath in Bradley road and alley off Park
Road will also be worked on.

Telford & Wrekin Council has been busy recruiting a growing army of volunteers to help keep roads and pathways clear if and when the bad weather hits this winter.

The Council already has 150 snow wardens and is looking to recruit a further 100 in the next year. Existing snow wardens are across the borough to ensure an even geographic spread and so that no areas get neglected.

Snow wardens clear and salt areas close to where they live that they identify as needing attention.


As a snow warden, they receive a high visibility vest, a pair of gloves, a snow shovel, a supply of salt and guidance on how to clear snow safely.

They cannot use the council's salt on private land, only the public highway.

# We're Watching You!!



A new campaign has set its sights on irresponsible dog owners after recent research showed that dog walkers are more likely to pick up after their dogs, when they think that they are being watched.

Keep Britain Tidy recently carried out an experiment where dog walkers had 'eyes' on them at all times and that saw a reduction of 46% in the levels of dog fouling. Dog fouling is more common in the evenings and during the winter months, as some dog owners feel they can't be seen 'under the cover of darkness'.

In Telford and Wrekin, the council is working closely with Police Community Support Officers to increase patrols in areas where there are lots of reports of dog fouling.

We are giving away free poop scoop bags which can be picked up from Donnington Library.

So there's no excuse for not picking up after your dog.
