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# 5.1 Telford and Wrekin Schools

There are a total of 66 state funded schools in Telford and Wrekin, four infant schools, three junior schools, 46 primary schools and 13 secondary schools. Attainment data throughout this section relates to pupils attending these schools.<sup>1</sup>


# 5.2 Early Years Foundation Stage Attainment

The Early Years Foundation Stage Profile assesses seven areas of learning and is measured by 17 early learning goals, each of which are assessed as emerging, expected or exceeding. Children will be defined as having reached a good level of development (GLD) if they achieve at least the expected level in the early learning goals in the prime areas of learning (personal, social and emotional development; physical development; communication and language) and in the specific areas of numeracy and literacy.

#### What is this data telling us?

In 2014 more than half (58.6%) of pupils living in Telford and Wrekin achieved a good level of development, an increase on 45.1% the previous year. Areas with the highest levels of achievement were Newport (69.2%) and Woodside (65.4%).

All areas have seen an increase between 2013 and 2014 in the proportion of pupils achieving a good level of development, with particular improvement seen in Malinslee (29.5% to 54.8%) and Donnington (39.2% to 59.6%).


# 5.3 Key Stage 1 Attainment

Key Stage 1 is year one and two in the primary school phase, ages five to seven. The expected level of achievement is level 2+ in reading, writing and mathematics.

#### Achieving level 2+ in 2014

What is this data telling us?

In 2014, almost nine out of ten (89.0%) of Telford and Wrekin pupils achieved a level 2+ in reading, the highest achieving areas being Newport (93.9%) and Dawley (91.4%) and lowest achievement seen in Hadley (84.6%).

Some 86.9% of Key Stage one pupils achieved a level 2+ in writing in 2014, varying from 81.1% in Hadley up to 95.3% in Newport.


Achievement in maths was highest of the three areas with 92.2% of Telford and Wrekin pupils achieving level 2+. Higher levels of achievement were seen in Newport (96.6%) and Oakengates and St Georges (95.6%). Areas with lower achievement in maths were Sutton Hill (88.0%) and Hadley (89.5%).

#### What is this data telling us?

The percentage of Key Stage 1 pupils achieving a level 2+ in reading in Telford and Wrekin has been increasing over the past five years from 83.6% in 2010 to 89.0% in 2014.

Arleston has seen the biggest improvement over the period moving from 77.0% to 90.3%.

Woodside and Newdale improved by more than 10% points, whilst Donnington, Brookside, Dawley and Malinslee have all improved by 5% points or more.


Only Wellington has fell by more the 1% point over the period.

# Achieving level 2+ in Writing

#### What is this data telling us?

The proportion of Key Stage 1 pupils achieving a level 2+ in Writing has increased over the past five years from 80.8% in 2010 to 86.9% in 2014. Lakeside South locality has seen a particular improvement from 77.3% in 2010 to 87.2% in 2014.

Woodside and Newdale improved by more than 15% points and Arleston improved by 13% points.Oakengates and St Georges, Brookside, Dawley and Sutton Hill have all improved by 5% points or more.


Only Wellington has decreased over the period.

# What is this data telling us?

The percentage of pupils achieving a level 2+ at Key Stage 1 in Maths has increased since 2010 from 88.3% to 92.2%.

Arleston and Newdale improved by more than 10% points. Oakengates and St Georges, Woodside and Malinslee have all improved by 5% points or more.

Newport, Sutton Hill and Wellington have decreased by 1% point or more over the period.



# What is this data telling us?

In 2014, nearly nine out of ten (88.8%) of Key Stage 2 pupils in Telford and Wrekin achieved a level 4+ in reading with the highest achieving area being Newport (98.6%) and lowest Woodside (80.8%).

Some 85.5% of Key Stage 2 pupils achieved a level 4+ in Writing in 2014. Levels of achievement varied across areas from 79.2% in Woodside to 91.1% in Oakengates and St Georges.


Just over four out of five Key Stage 2 pupils (84.8%) achieved a level 4+ in Maths in 2014, with the lowest achievement seen in Arleston (73.6%) and highest in Newport (94.4%).

# What is this data telling us?

Since 2011 the percentage of Key Stage 2 pupils achieving a level 4+ in reading has increased from 84.3% to 88.8%.

Hadley and Arleston have improved by 10% points between 2011 and 2014. Newport, Oakengates, Dawley, Sutton Hill and Malinslee all improved by 5% points in the same period.


Woodside, Newdale and Wellington have all seen a reduction of 1% point or more.

# Achieving Level 4+ in Writing

# What is this data telling us?

Key Stage 2 attainment in writing for Telford and Wrekin pupils has increased since 2011 from 73.5% to 85.5%.

All areas have seen an improvement over the period 2011 to 2014. Malinslee and Arleston have seen a significant improvement, 25% points from 58.5% to 83.5% and 23.4% points from 60.6% to 84% respectively.


Hadley, Oakengates and St Georges, Brookside, Sutton Hill and Newdale have improved by 10% points or more between 2011 and 2014.

# What is this data telling us?

Key Stage 2 attainment in Maths for Telford and Wrekin pupils has increased from 79.7% in 2011 to 84.8% in 2014.

Hadley and Malinslee have improved by 10% points or more between 2011 and 2014. Newport, Oakengates, Brookside, Dawley and Woodside all improved by 5% points or more in the same period.



#### What is this data telling us?

In 2014 Telford and Wrekin pupils made the same progress as pupils from the rest of England for Reading and Writing and closed the gap in Maths to 1.1% point.

In Reading, Oakengates and St Georges had the most pupils making expected progress in 2014 at 93.5%. Dawley was the most improved, increasing by almost 12% points from 2013.

In Writing, Arleston had the most pupils making expected progress in 2014 at 97.1%. Brookside was the most improved increasing by 5% points from 2013.

In Maths, Oakengates and St Georges had the most pupils making expected progress in 2014 at 95.3%. Dawley was the most improved, increasing by 11%


# 5.12 Key Stage 4 - GCSE Attainment


Between 2010 and 2012 the GCSE attainment 5 A\* to C including Maths and English measure rose from 55.9% to 61.3% putting Telford and Wrekin above the England average. In 2013 there was a decrease to 58.6% with Telford and Wrekin, falling the below England rate.

In 2014 Telford and Wrekin were just over 5% points below the England rate.

In 2014 Telford and Wrekin were just over 5% points below the England rate.




# What is this data telling us?

Between 2010 and 2012 expected progress in Maths rose from 62.7% to 70.5%. This improvement saw Telford and Wrekin exceed the England average. Since 2012 the expected progress in Maths has fallen to 58.8% putting Telford and Wrekin approximately 8% points below the England rate in 2014.

Over the period 2010 to 2014 expected progress in English has varied only slightly from a low of 67.6% in 2010 and 2011 to a high of 69.9% in 2013. Expected progress in English in Telford and Wrekin has remained below the England rate for all of this period.


In 2014, the percentage of pupils achieving expected progress was 68.5, 4.5% points below the England rate of 73.0%.

#### What is this data telling us?

Around a fifth (19.2%) of Telford and Wrekin pupils have a Special Education Need, some 3,950 children. The most common need is 'Moderate Learning Difficulties' (1,121 children) followed by 'Behavioural, Emotional and Social Disorders' (808 children) and 'Speech, Language and Communication Needs' (683 children).


#### 5.15 Attainment gaps

Disadvanted pupils are those who are, or have been, eligible for free school meals and have claimed them in the last 6 years at the time of the January Census and children continuously looked after for over 6 months, as taken from the LA returns in March. Other pupils consist of all those who are not disadvantaged.

What is this data telling us?

In 2012 the attainment gap between disadvantaged and other pupils was 26% points this was 7% points worse that England. However, in 2013 the gap had been cut to 17% points placing Telford and Wrekin 1% point above England.


In 2014, the gap in Telford and Wrekin remained the same whereas England narrowed leaving Telford and Wrekin 1% point below England.

# What is this data telling us?


In England, between 2012 and 2014, the gap between disadvantaged and other pupils has remained approximately the same. In Telford and Wrekin the gap has increased 4% points from 30 to 34% points. This means Telford and Wrekin have moved from being 3% points behind England in 2012 to 6% points in 2014.

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# What is this data telling us?

Around 1 in 4 (24.6%) people in Telford and Wrekin have no qualifications, higher than the England rate (22.5%). A smaller proportion of the population of Telford and Wrekin have Level 4+ qualifications (T&W 20.9%, England 27.4%)

The Lakeside South locality has the highest population of residents without qualifications (27.8%), with Sutton Hill being the highest area (32.0%).

The area with the highest percentage of population with Level 4+ qualifications was Newport (28.5%) whereas Brookside (14.2%) had the lowest.
