




# Independent Care Act Advocacy





## Independent Care Act Advocacy



The care act is a law about care and support for adults in England.



It means that the council must involve you when your care and support is being looked at.





It also means that the council must make sure you have an advocate if you find it difficult to have a say in your care.





An advocate will help you if you do not have anyone else who can support you.



# The council must offer you an advocate if:



You have trouble understanding information about decision you need to make



You have trouble remembering information



You have trouble using information to be involved in the decisions you need to make



You have trouble telling people your views, wishes and feelings



# An advocate will work with you:



An advocate is there for you





To help you to understand information and processes





To help you to understand your rights under the Care Act.





To support you to understand how your care and support needs can be met.



## An advocate will work with you:



To help you to make decisions about your care and support arrangements



To help you to tell others your views, wishes and feelings and what you want




To support you at meetings or when talking with professionals



To help you to challenge a decision made about you by the council that you are unhappy with

### **Advocacy**

This is about understanding your rights and choices.



#### **Advocate**

An advocate is a person who will help you to make sure your voice is heard.



#### **Care Plan**

A care plan is a document that says what needs to be done to support you.




### **Care review**

A care review is a check to see if the outcomes in your care plan are being met.
